

Cultus Lake Sailing Club

Storage Policy

1. Eligibility for Storage:

- a. Only members of CLSC may apply for and retain storage
- b. The applicant must own the boat being stored.
- c. When a boat is jointly owned, all owners must be members of CLSC.
- d. Members must re-apply for storage rights each year with their membership renewal.
- e. It is the decision of the Club Executive to allocate available space.

2. Priority of Storage:

- a. Priority for space will be allocated on the following basis:
 - i. Boats that belong to the CLSC (Lesson boats, Club boats)
 - ii. Active members
- b. Active members will be defined as those members who actively sail their boats and are active volunteers in support of the club functions.
- c. Inactive and member boats shall be requested in writing by the CLSC executive at their last known address to remove their boat or risk having it removed at the owners expense and risk.
- d. Inactive and non-member boats shall be removed at the owners expense and risk and handed over to the Cultus Lake Parks Board. Every attempt will be made to contact the owner before this action is taken.
- e. If members remove their boats for an extended period (2 months) during the sailing season (May to October), they must notify an Executive member so the space may be temporarily re-allocated. They will not lose their priority for that space.

3. Rights to Use of Storage

- a. Storage rights are not transferable
- b. When a boat is sold, the boat must be removed from the compound
- c. Members may change the type of boat stored without losing their priority.

4. Member and Club Responsibilities:

- a. Members are required to maintain their space in a neat and tidy manner
- b. Boats are required to be kept in good, clean condition.
- c. CLSC cannot guarantee the security of boats and equipment and cannot accept responsibility for damage or loss due to theft, vandalism, weather or any other causes.
- d. Members are responsible for securing their boats and will be held responsible if their boat damages another boat or club property.
- e. Failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in a request for removal of their boat and loss of storage privileges.

5. ANNUAL STORAGE FEES

Storage is allocated on a first come, first served basis with priority given to active, current members in good standing. Decisions are made by the Club Executive. Storage fee calculations are outlined below with measurements to be taken as the maximum length and width of the boat. Road trailers are not allowed to be stored in the compound.
